

As a professional DJ who wishes to be a force in the industry, you need to do your research. Harness the power of cutting-edge technology like YouTube, search videos of other DJs who work on cruise ships and establish a rapport with other professional DJs who work on cruise ships. I started a Facebook group called “Travelling DJs” <https://www.facebook.com/groups/TravelingDJs>. This group is home to over 8,000 active DJs, making it a great place to meet someone who can

share his or her experiences with you. The key to getting an interview done is creative marketing, so you have to be prepared. You have to update your resume along with your [DJ Press kit](#). I highly recommend you take a video of yourself performing your magic at an event. Videos are very vital to the business and go a long way towards sharing your real personality with those you are hoping will hire you. These are proven techniques that keep you ahead of your competitors and help in marketing yourself today!

Chapter 2: What are some of the best ways to travel the world?

There are a number of ways you can see the world. Of course the easiest (if you have the money) is to just take a vacation to any destination you want to visit. A lot of people decide to get a travel visa and find work as they travel the world. If you have some education behind you, you also could land a position in a large corporation where you travel for work. The downside of working as you travel is you unfortunately tend to spend a lot more time working than you actually do seeing and enjoying the sights.

Another option for traveling the world is to join the military. This experience stays with you for a lifetime and gives you a small income, but long-term benefits if you stick with it.

But you can also be a cruise ship DJ and tour around the world. From St. Thomas to the Virgin Islands, from the Caribbean to Sicily, from the Mediterranean to Paris and more – you can travel all over the world with the opportunities a position as a cruise ship DJ offers.



Chapter 3: How can you escape the reality of normal, boring day-to-day life?

You can see all kinds of places this way, and if you have a great full-time job that pays you for vacation time off, even better. But you can easily spend \$2,000 to \$10,000 on a single vacation. You could go to places like China and teach kids English, or join the Peace Corps, where you get the chance to make a real difference in the world.

If you love writing or photography, this is another way you can get quite a few stamps on your passport. Travel writers and photographers can make decent money, and see places few others have. Instead, a fantastic way for you to travel might be to get one of the coolest jobs on the planet – as a traveling DJ on a cruise ship! With this career you make money, meet people from all walks of life, and no two days are ever alike.

Anyone can have a job they love every single day, so if you're bored in the same city with the same people, and want the adventure of a lifetime, put together your DJ Press Kit and start down the road to your new lifestyle (don't forget your video too!).

Chapter 4: How can you get better weather, and escape the cold winters?

Do you live in an cold climate, and dread the winters? If you're longing to get away on a regular basis, become a snowbird, where you buy a second home in Florida or the Caribbean and travel back and forth, spending six months at home during the summer months, and the rest somewhere warm. Many people can't afford this at least without planning and saving for it ahead of time, but if you can swing it, spending the winter months every year away from the cold is an excellent way to get away and even set up a second set of friends in a warmer climate.

It's not a stretch, and you could even land a full time job as a DJ at one of these resorts, just from your experience and exposure as a cruise ship DJ.

Chapter 6: How can you live rent-free and save a ton of money?

Of course if you want to travel you will need a financial plan in place to help you save money. One of our biggest expenditures is where we live. There are some options to help you lower those living expenses so you have more money saved to get away as soon as we can.

First, you can get one or more roommates. This is a great way to split bills to help make living more affordable for everyone. When two, three, or four people share rent, it can cut an enormous expense down tremendously, if you have enough space to comfortably live this way. Keep in mind this is great as a short-term plan, but just be aware that most people don't get along well forever, and it can be a revolving door.

Another option to consider is to become a house sitter, where much of the time you are staying in someone else's home while they travel. Sure, this can help you save money on rent, but wouldn't you rather be the one traveling and have to get your own house sitter?

Grants and housing assistance programs are a great way to save money on rent and housing. Those can take a while to get, and you end up living in not so suitable locations.

Lastly, you can work on a cruise ship and get a friend to stay at your place and charge them rent. This is a wonderful way to save money. When you're a cruise ship DJ, your expenses are reduced considerably. You don't pay for:

- Room and board
- Most food
- Gasoline for your car
- Vacation time
- Travel to the coolest places on Earth
- And many, many more expenses.



Chapter 7: Where can I meet new people in cities all over the world, and open up new opportunities?

Being a cruise ship DJ is one great way to meet new people from all over. Here's how I know: With Princess Cruise Lines, 60% of my cruises were Caribbean cruises. One of my most favorite places to go was St. Thomas. If you haven't been there before, the beaches are turquoise, the shopping is outstanding, and the people are lovely and know how to treat visitors.

Here's why it's my favorite place: You get off the ship, pack up your laptop, take the bus, go through the city, tour areas, go to an internet cafe, connect with friends and family, catch a bite to eat at a local restaurant and even do some shopping. In many ways it feels almost like home.

Another way to meet people is at local bars and coffee places. While you're there be sure to get contact information from the people who work there. Since most people who work together in these places know not just people from their bar or café, but they also know people from other spots in the industry too. After you visit, follow up with them. This can help connect you with managers and event planners at the nightclubs and beach bars – all new people that can help you get your next gigs. It's the network that counts.

The diversity of a Wedding DJ is perfect for a cruise ship DJ. The people I was introduced to, and the people they know, have benefited me for years. DJ work is a relatively tight-knit community - the key is to be one that is known, and the networks you create and nurture will get you more work for years to come.

If you are already an internationally-renowned DJ, club owners and others are calling you or your agent all the time to have you entertain their high profile audiences. These people know the right people and have the right connections all over the world. Their biggest problem in life is deciding which gig or job to choose.

The successful DJs understand it's not about just a good resume, they also know it's a must to always be building their network of connections. That's where becoming a cruise ship DJ can give you far-reaching and long-term opportunities not found in any other profession.
